# **Committee Reports**

### Membership

The Membership Committee has completed the second draft of Membership Requirements document which will eventually be sent to the board for its approval.

Please take the time to review this draft and send your recommendations by January 30, 2010 to:

There was a general concern that as a volunteer organization, some of the expectations in the draft are a bit excessive. I have taken this in account by making the following recommendations.

An Active Member will: Provide 12 hours of in-service to LCERT per year and Complete 4 hours of continuing education per year

An Emeritus Member will provide at least 500 hours of service to the organization

Someone suggested that we offer quarterly in-service opportunities and that we accept CE from other professional organizations such as the American Society of Safety Engineers.

One team leader mentioned that some members sign up for training because of requirements of their agencies/employers. Some of these people are inactive. We recommend that agencies pay tuition for employees who are required to take the program. There is also an issue about inactive members keeping their equipment. Should they be required to turn the equipment back to LCERT?

There are three classifications of membership:

### Active

### Inactive

**Emeritus** (One who is retired but retains an honorary title corresponding to that held immediately before retirement)

An **active member** will complete the CERT class and within 12 months of class completion, provide 12 hours of service to the organization.

This service can include:

- Participate in local neighborhood, team activities, meetings, events, and training
- -Attend community educational events
- -Attend the LCERT Annual Meeting

- -Participate in LCERT drills, training events, support CERT class final exam activities
- -Inform the general public (neighborhoods, churches) about LCERT membership
- -Participate on LCERT Committees
- -Participate in quarterly in-service opportunities

After the first year, the **active LCERT member** will provide **12** hours of service to the organization and will complete at least **4** hours of continuing education credits. The Continuing Education credits must be approved by the LCERT Board of Directors and can include classes listed on the LCERT website. If a member wishes to attend a class that is not listed on the website, he (she) must submit the request to the Board for approval. Classes eligible include the ICS 300/400 and all the FEMA on line courses.

If a member does not complete the above requirements in two years of class completion, that person will be listed as CERT Trained but inactive.

If a member is unable to participate because of illness of other circumstances, the LCERT Board can extend active membership as needed. The Board can also endorse a leave of absence if necessary. The Board can review and reactivate members if requested.

### **Emeritus Member:**

An active member can be considered eligible for Emeritus status if he (she) fulfills the yearly requirements to qualify as active, and has provided at least 500 hours of volunteer service to the organization.

### **Recording of Volunteer Hours:**

A timekeeper designated by the Membership Committee will be responsible for tabulating volunteer hours and CE training units. We can accomplish this by using the

Excel membership database and adding two additional columns for tracking hours. Tracking will be conducted on a calendar year basis (January- December).

Attendance sheets from all LCERT events will be submitted to the committee for update to the database. LCERT members are responsible for updating the Membership Committee quarterly for all hours of volunteer service completed on activities not tracked by the LCERT organization. These activities may include special events or training activities approved by the Board.

How can you help?


